

The Conference on English Education of the National Council of Teachers of English (NCTE) has given the 2009 Richard Meade Award to Bob Land, CSU LA Los Angeles Writing Project, and Carol Booth Olson, UCI Writing Project for their Pathway Project research in Santa Ana Unified School District. The NCTE established this award to recognize published research that investigates English/Language Arts teacher development. It was established in 1988 in honor of the late Richard Meade of the University of Virginia for his contributions to research in the teaching of composition and in teacher preparation. Bob Land and Carol Booth Olson are receiving the Richard Meade Award for their article, "Taking a Reading/Writing Intervention for Secondary English Language Learners on the Road: Lessons Learned about Professional Development and Adolescent Literacy from the Pathway Project." They will be honored at the NCTE Convention in Philadelphia from Nov. 19-22, 2009.
