The Scholastic Art & Writing Awards are the most longest-running and prestigious recognition program for creative teenage students grades 7 -12. The California Arts Project is proud to be a sponsor of this exciting opportunity for student artists across California.

Eligibility

Scholastic Art & Writing Awards is open to students:

- grades 7 -12 for the 2010/2011 school year,
- enrolled in public, private, parochial, and home schools or participating in community based organizations,
- in the United States, U.S. territories, Canada and U.S. sponsored schools abroad.

Note: Artwork created in the spring semester of 2010 is eligible for submission. Students should submit in their *current* grade level. Seniors who graduated in June 2010 are *not* eligible to participate.

All students who intend to submit their artwork must register on the website of the Alliance for Young Artists & Writers, www.artandwriting.org after September 15, 2010. For all California students, not in Los Angeles County, you will upload digital images of your artwork through Online Registration. Students 12 and under will send in their images on CD-ROM to ensure COPPA compliance.
