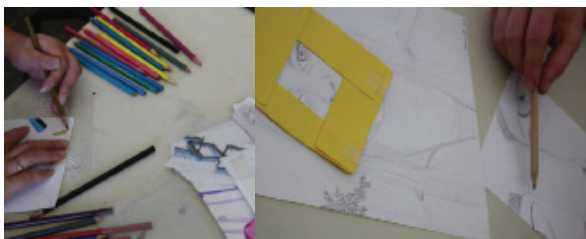


Program Description

This program develops teachers' visual arts literacy and drawing skills aligned with the California K-8 Visual Arts Content Standards and Common Core Literacy in Technical Subjects. Through engaging directly in the visual arts, teachers uncover the content, literacy, artistic processes, and develop skills to begin to support student literacy in the visual arts. Teachers discover the connections and support visual arts education provides to the English Language Arts Common Core and English Language Development Standards.
